At this point, Clarissa joined the chat. Clarissa's chat icon is a multicolored picture of stars.

Clarissa: I can help! What makes you think you might be pregnant?

- Positive test result
- I noticed symptoms
- Just worries

Clarissa: Symptoms of pregnancy usually begin around 2-3 weeks after the sexual encounter. Has it been that long?

- Yes, it has
- Not quite

Clarissa: Okay, great. That means it has been long enough that you might notice the most common symptoms. If you've noticed nausea or vomiting, frequent urination, full/sore breasts, or a missed period, it would be a good idea to take a pregnancy test.

Clarissa: Have you taken a pregnancy test yet?

Victoria: that

Victoria: what kind of services are you looking for?

Tracy: I want to talk about my options. I just lost my job and I already have two kids. I don't

know if I can afford to have a third

Victoria: I understand that we are facing a difficult time with the pandemic

Victoria: But just know things will get better

Victoria: As a nation we will bounce back and you will work again

Victoria: I am so sorry for everything you are going through right now

Tracy: It's a really scary time. I just don't think right now is a good time to be pregnant

Victoria: Are you sure you would want to have an abortion?

Victoria: There is a lot of help available out there for you right now

Victoria: I know it all seems overwhelming for sure

Victoria: There are side effects

Victoria: depression anxiety are the most common but others are more severe like infertility

although not as common

Victoria: Have you filed for unemployment?

Tracy: I didn't know infertility was a side effect

Victoria: it isn't common but it has happened. It happened to a friend of mine

Tracy: Oh wow. That's so scary

I was then prompted to enter my zip code. I entered a zip code in Kansas City, Kansas - 66106.

Victoria: This location can help you. I am not sure if they are open right now but know they will be soon if not now

Victoria: A lot of women suffer with regret and depression

Victoria: Which is the most common. It isn't an easy thing to endure

Victoria: If you at all want to keep your baby then you should. Things will get better

Tracy: I don't know anyone who has gotten one but I thought it was the only option

Victoria: File for unemployment and food stamps

Victoria: Right now they are offering a lot to families

Victoria: its [sic] pretty incredible how much help there is out there

Tracy: I've never been on welfare before

Tracy: Is there enough money to support three kids and my husband?

Victoria: I have never been on welfare before either and right now my husband is loosing [sic] a side job we applied for food stamps and are now getting a good amount

Victoria: it helps ALOT [sic]

Victoria: family of 4 like \$600

Victoria: a month for three months

Tracy: I never thought I would have to go on welfare before. I've worked hard my whole life

Tracy: Getting pregnant right now just makes everything scarier

Victoria: I hear ya. People are loosing [sic] their jobs left and right. My sister in law is a physical therapist assistant and is a single mom she just lost her job last week

Victoria: its [sic] hard

Victoria: You just have to remember this is all temporary

Victoria: We will rise from this

Tracy: The finance stuff will be helpful for talking to my husband

Tracy: Is there anything else I should tell him to convince him to let me keep the baby? Otherwise he might think abortion is a good option

Victoria: Well for one you shouldn't do something you dont [sic] want to do

Victoria: I know things are hard but if you don't want to then he shouldn't make you do it. ALL of this crisis is temporary

Victoria: You can get unemployment and food stamps for now

Victoria: Which everyone is having to do because of loosing [sic] jobs

Victoria: But again this is all temporary

Tracy: Thanks Victoria. I'm so glad you told me about the infertility side effect. I'm going to talk to my husband later about welfare too so hopefully he will be happy about the pregnancy

Victoria: I'm glad I was here for you.

Victoria: I certainly wish you the best Tracy
